

What Do the Different Blue Highlights Mean?

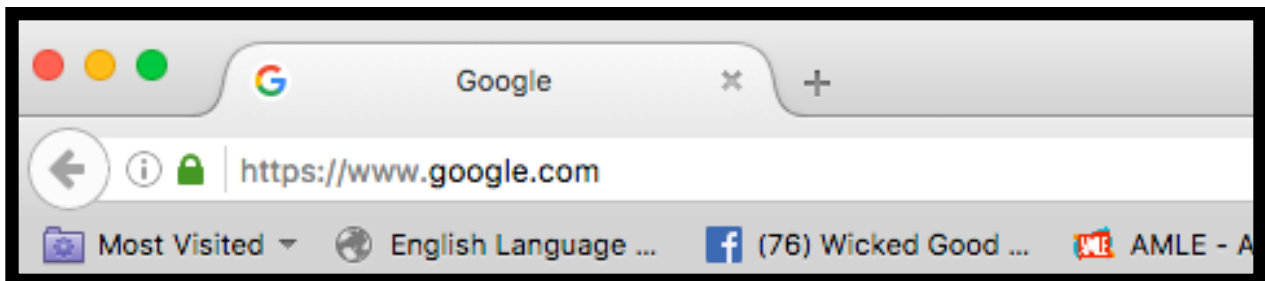
Sometimes a click on an URL address or folder brings up a light blue highlighting and others times one sees dark blue. What's the difference?



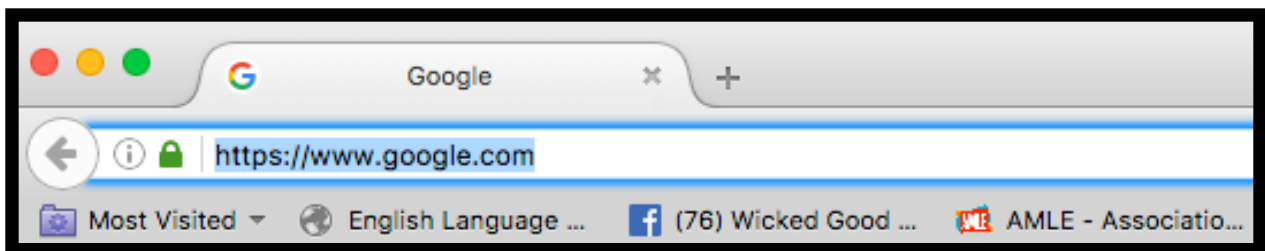
Very simply:

- Light blue means you can immediately start typing and replace existing text. No deleting necessary.
- Dark blue means double click to open file.

However, the highlighting works a little differently in different places.



Click once to get light blue.



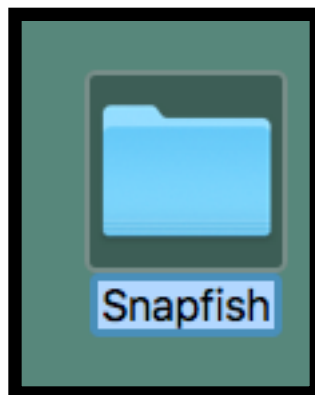
1. In **some browsers such as Firefox**, if you click once on the URL, it will turn light blue and you can begin to type a new URL address.

2. When you **click once on a folder**, you will get a dark blue highlighting

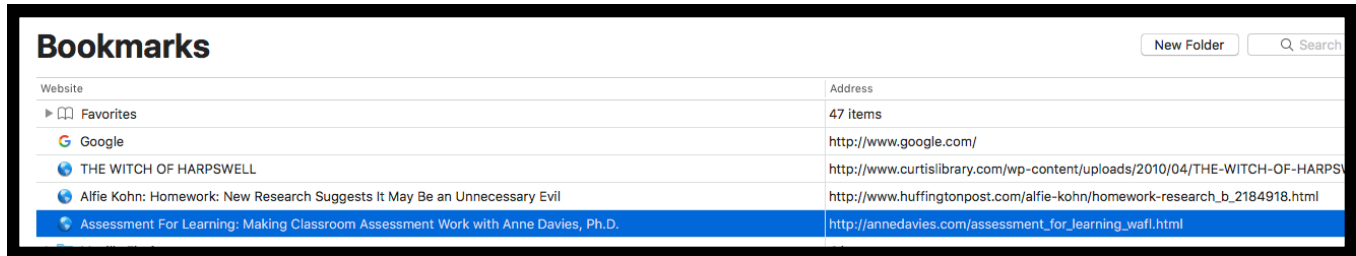


If you **double click now**, the file will open.

However, if you just **single click once again**, the highlighting turns light blue. You can now start typing and change the name of the file.

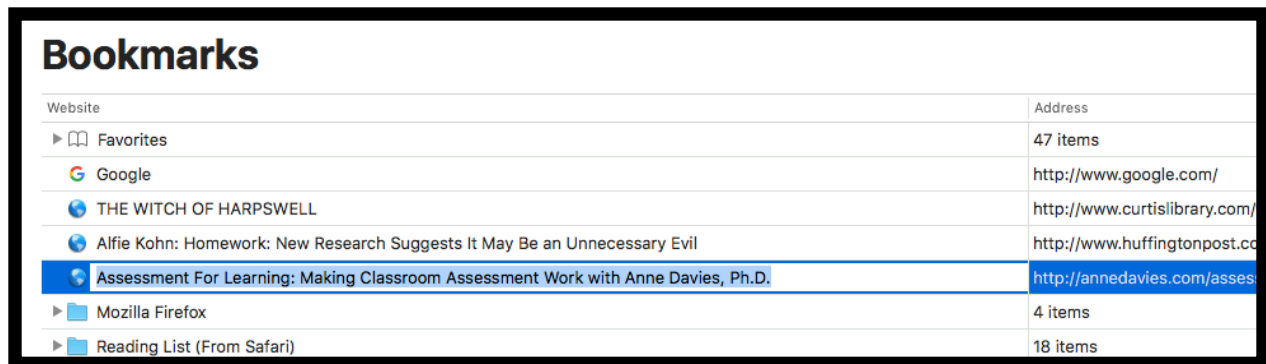


3. In **Safari**, you can edit your bookmarks. Click on Bookmarks in the menu and scroll down to Edit Bookmarks.



One click, highlights in dark blue and you can delete, if you wish, the bookmark by hitting your delete key.

One more click, however, turns the highlighting to light blue and you can begin typing to change the the text.



The BIG Take Away?

When you see light blue highlighting, you can just begin to type. Do not worry about deleting previous text, it will automatically disappear.
